Integrated Processes	
Caring	Treating clients with respect and dignity is vital to LPN nursing practice.
Clinical Judgement	Critical thinking + Decision making
Communication and Documentation	Verbal and nonverbal interaction between the LPN and the client, and the healthcare team. Client care is documented in written and/or electronic records.
Culture and Spirituality	Respect for client's cultural and spiritual beliefs.
Nursing Process	Clinical problem-solving process that includes data collection, planning, implementation and evaluation.
Teaching and Learning	Prior to any teaching/learning, the nurse must assess if the client is ready and motivated to learn

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NURSING PROCESS

- Assessment – the nurse gathers subjective and objective data to identify actual or potential problems
- Analysis – the nurse summarizes and interprets the assessment data
- Planning – the nurse sets priorities, determines goals, and develops the plan of care in collaboration with the multidisciplinary team.
- Implementation – the nurse completes nursing interventions required to reach the desired goals
- Evaluation – evaluation is a continuous process which serves to compare the actual outcomes with expected ones and determines the need to change the plan of care.

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CLINICAL JUDGMENT

- This process allows LPN nurses to decide what info needs to be collected about a client, interprets and analyzes that information, identifies appropriate nursing actions and evaluates the results of those interventions.

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NURSING PROCESS VS. CLINICAL JUDGEMENT MODEL

NURSING PROCESS	NCJMM
ASSESSMENT	RECOGNIZED CUES – What is most important?
ANALYSIS	ANALYZE CUES – What does the relevant client data mean? PRIORITIZE HYPOTHESES – Which client needs require immediate attention?
PLANNING	GENERATE SOLUTIONS – Which potential interventions are needed to provide safe care?
IMPLEMENTATION	TAKE ACTION – Which interventions are appropriate to meet the desired clients outcomes?
EVALUATION	EVALUATE OUTCOMES – Were the expected outcomes met, unmet, or partially met?

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NEXT-GENERATION NCLEX (NGN)

- The Next Gen NCLEX will measure Clinical Judgement in two different ways:

1. Unfolding Case Studies

2. Stand-alone Question Items

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NEXT-GENERATION NCLEX (NGN) Unfolding Case Studies

- Test takers can expect to have 3 NGN case studies, with 6 questions each. These questions will measure each of the 6 cognitive skills of the Clinical Judgement Model (NCJMM). in this order:

1. Recognize cues
2. Analyze Cues
3. Prioritize Hypotheses
4. Generate Solutions
5. Take Action
6. Evaluate Outcomes

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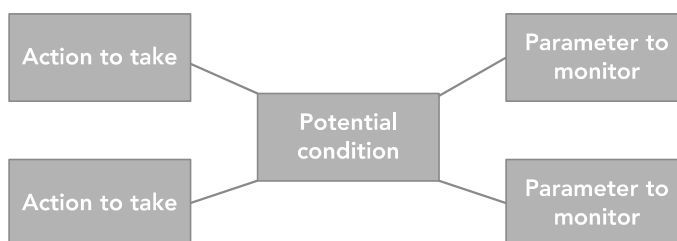
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NEXT-GENERATION NCLEX (NGN) Stand-alone Question

- **Bow-Tie** – includes all 6 functions of clinical judgement in one question.



- **Trend** – the student reviews information in the medical record that happens (**trends**) over time (in **hours, days, or longer**).

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6 COGNITIVE SKILLS – RECOGNIZE CUES

- What are cues?
- Cues are assessment findings that nurses use as a basis for making sound clinical decisions.

1. Recognize cues – Review of client's assessment data to determine important or immediate concerns in the clinical scenario

- Age
- Health history
- Signs and symptoms
- Lab values
- Vital signs
- Medical diagnosis
- Rapid clinical decline



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STRATEGIES FOR ANSWERING NGN QUESTIONS: Recognize Cues

- You will need to determine which client finding is:
 - Normal OR Abnormal
- Abnormal and expected in the clinical scenario
e.g., COPD client with SO₂ 88-92% - hypoxic drive
 - Abnormal and not expected (**most important**)
- Decide which client findings are most important and which ones require follow up, and/or are of immediate concern. Life threatening.



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6 COGNITIVE SKILLS – Analyze Cues

2. Analyze cues – What does the relevant client data mean at this time?

- You will need to interpret (analyze) this information.

STRATEGIES FOR ANSWERING NGN QUESTIONS: Analyze Cues

- **You need to ask yourself:**
 - What is your interpretation of the abnormal and/or unexpected findings.
 - What are the complications that can occur to this client?



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6 COGNITIVE SKILLS – Prioritize Hypotheses

- **What are hypotheses?**
 - Hypotheses are tentative explanations that you make about a clinical scenario to determine the client's most important needs.

3. Prioritize Hypotheses – This cognitive skill requires that you narrow down what the data means and prioritize the client's needs.

- You will need to rank (order) them to determine what is the priority health problem.

STRATEGIES FOR ANSWERING NGN QUESTIONS: Prioritize Hypotheses

- **You need to determine:**
 - Urgency (life-threatening conditions/urgent/non-urgent)
 - Safety Issues
